Principal's report - Title one program

Annual title one report - We are required to do a parent report every year.

We receive free lunch because of our Title 1 status.

44 Elementary title school, 6 Middle, 5 High, 8 Private schools who receive Title one funds.

School wide Title 1 program - we look at high quality instruction, professional development, funds can be used together (no need to separate).

Comprehensive Achievement Plan (CAP) - helps guide where to spend funds.

School wide means more than 40% (we have 74%) lower income families.

Our two school goals are DSC1.1 (safe, respectful culturally-inclusive environment) and EE2.2 (high quality instruction). PBIS and Zones of Regulation, CORE reading interventions and Zoophonics, streamline SST with reading data, Rtl on a rotating basis, ELD, Math instructional strategies (concrete, visual, abstract).

Assessments:

SBAC Oregon Smarter Balanced aligned with CCSS. Used to measure progress toward standards in literacy and math. Progress monitoring: DRA and EDL, running records, EasyCBM. ELPA assessment. EasyCBM screening in literacy and math three times a year.

(Questions: How long have we been Title 1? Many years. How long have we used EasyCBM? This is our first year. How much time spent in these big assessments? Could be 6 to 8 hours for SBAC and ELPA together)

Parent Involvement:

We have a parent/school compact (go over at conferences). These are held for two years.

Parent notifications, autodialer, newsletter.

We have a policy online, if you would like to see the full text.

ESSA:

Teachers must be certified, highly qualified. Instructional assistants are also highly qualified.

Student Achievement:

Teachers can give best update on individual students. SBAC data can be accessed from principal and/or teacher. School report card in available on line.
